

SUBJECT: SOLICITATION CTCP 12-10439 YOUTH RECRUITMENT FOR RETAIL

DATA COLLECTION, ADDENDUM 3

The purpose of this letter is to address three questions raised by a prospective proposer.

Question 1:

May prospective agencies submit letters of support with their application?

Question 1 Answer:

Letters of support are not required in this Solicitation. The California Tobacco Control Program will not review or consider letters of support during the course of review, scoring, or award.

Question 2:

Does the SOW (scope of work) five-page maximum include only the three-year period from Feb 1, 2013-Jan 30, 2016 or is the SOW for the two-year extension period included in that five-page maximum? If it is not included, what is the page maximum for the SOW for the two-year extension period from Feb 1, 2016-Jan 30, 2018?

Question 2 Answer:

There is a five page maximum for the three year period beginning February 1, 2013 through January 30, 2016 and a five page maximum for the two year extension beginning February 1, 2016 through January 30, 2018. The five page maximum allowance for the two year extension period is stated on page nine of the CTCP Solicitation 12-10439 - Revised 11-15-12 document located here:

Question 3:

Which agency is responsible for coordinating the decoy operations with the law enforcement agencies. Is it the prospective agency, the FDB (Food & Drug Bureau) or the CDPH/CTCP?

The California Department of Public Health, Food and Drug Branch is responsible for coordinating decoy operations with law enforcement agencies.
